

“The Most Dangerous Game” Plot Map

Directions: Now that we have finished “The Most Dangerous Game”, you will work in a **group of three** to create a plot map for the story. Your plot map must cover:

Exposition (setting and characters)

Sources of Conflict in the story (note: there is more than one, refer to your notes)

Rising Action

Climax

Falling Action

Resolution

Each member of your group will be responsible for two portions of the plot map. Each portion of the plot map must include:

-A written explanation of the portion of the plot

This written explanation should explain the element of plot that you have selected. You should provide examples from the story to back up your explanation.

-Evidence from the novel to support the explanation

Your evidence should be a single quote that represents your portion of the plot. By quote, I mean a passage from the story that you put in quotation marks and cite according to MLA format (we will go over how to do this). Your quote does not have to, but can be, dialogue from the story. It is called a quote because you are quoting the text instead of using your own words.

-An illustration to accompany the explanation and evidence

Your illustration should depict the part of the story that you are describing in your explanation. While you are not being graded on your artistic abilities, you should do your best, make the illustration neat, and include color.

After each group member completes his/her individual portion of the plot map you will take all of the work and glue it to a poster in order to create the visual of the plot map we discussed in our notes.

This poster will be worth **30 points**:

-10 points for the explanation

-10 points for the evidence

-5 points for your illustration

-5 points for overall neatness/organization
